on top of Cain before he noticed him walking in the road. He immediately stopped and remained at the scene until Police Chief Art O'Neil arrived.

A coroner's jury is being impanelled today, and inquest on details of the accident will be held later this week, Coroner William Gallagher said this morning. Arrangements for funeral services have not yet been completed.

James Cain was 56 years of age at the time of death, and had been a resident of Oconto nearly all his life. Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Maude Cain, five sons, Orville of Milwaukee, Robert of Ripon, John now in the South Pacific serving with the U. S. Navy and Harold and Clarence of Oconto, and three daughters, Mrs. Clarence Steinhaus of Oconto, Mrs. Roland McDowell of Denmark, and Charlotte at home. Other survivors include nine grandchildren, his mother, Mrs. Carrie Cain of Oconto, and four brothers and two sisters, Bert and Milton of Oconto, Harry of Baraboo, William of Portland, Oregon, Mrs. Frank Rousseau (Mildred) of Milwaukee and Mrs. V. H. Johns of Wabeno."<sup>62</sup>

19. Henry C. (Harry) CAIN. Born May 16, 1892.<sup>63</sup> Was a Sgt. in the US Army in WWI. According to his nephew Robert Cain he worked for the FBI after he left the military and would visit his family often. After he retired from the FBI he went to work for Snap-on-Tools. He died in 1977.<sup>64</sup>

### **Harry C. Cain**

"Harry C. Cain, 85, 423 N. W. Barstow, Waukesha, died at his home June 27.

He was born May 16, 1892 in Oconto and attended Oconto schools. He left here a young man.

Survivors are one sister-in-law, Mrs. Maude Cain of Oconto, and nieces and nephews.

A prayer service was held Wednesday night at the Gallagher-Pinkart funeral home. Funeral services were held Thursday morning at St. Peter's Catholic church, the Rev. Robert Karuhn officiating. Burial was in the Oconto Catholic cemetery."<sup>65</sup>

20. Mary Mildred CAIN. Born November 24, 1894 (TWIN).<sup>66</sup> Mildred married Frank Rousseau<sup>67</sup> and lived with him in Milwaukee until her death on 21 November 1965.<sup>68</sup> She left behind 4 children. It is rumored that Mildred and her sister Gertrude had a falling out over politics in their later years and never spoke to each other again. An example of why one should never discuss politics or religion.

21. Milton J. CAIN. Born November 24, 1894 (TWIN).<sup>69</sup>

### **Oconto County Reporter, July 18, 1907**

"Milton, the twelve year old son of John Kane, while playing near the cog wheel at Oconto Company's foundry Monday had his arm caught in the wheel and badly bruised."<sup>70</sup>

He was a Private in the US Army in WWI and eventually became Mayor of Oconto twice. He died November 8, 1972.<sup>71</sup>

### **Ex-Mayor Cain Dead At Age 78**

"Former Mayor Milton J. Cain of Oconto died Wednesday at Oconto Memorial hospital following an extensive illness.

Mr. Cain, a popular vote-getter in both Oconto and Oconto county, served as mayor for two separate terms, from 1952-1954 and from 1958-1960.
